4. One page document with: excel table outlining your requested amount, proposed budget, area of focus & travel agenda.
5. Two reference letters from faculty directly involved in the healthcare architecture program or directly involved with the student.

Applications will be reviewed by the AAH Foundation. The selected recipient(s) will be announced at the AIA Academy of Architecture for Health Update 2019 PDC Conference in Phoenix, AZ. The selected recipient(s) agrees to prepare a summary report of their travel experiences to the Foundation.

A final report and/or presentation will be required at conclusion of the travel.
